

Assessment of Overseas-Trained Subspecialists (Category 3)

Eligibility Prerequisites

1. Permanent resident or Australian/New Zealand citizen.
2. Medical registration in Australia or New Zealand.
3. At least 80% of clinical practice time must be devoted to the subspecialty.
4. The applicant must have been a consultant in subspecialty practice in Australia or New Zealand (or a College-recognised overseas institution) for a minimum of three years.
5. Subspecialist applications should be supported by at least **ten** peer reviewed publications and **five** presentations relating to the subspecialty at local, national and international meetings.
6. Applicants should hold a position as a specialist in a practice/hospital in which the subspecialty is recognised.

Interview

1. The applicant is to be interviewed by the Branch Education Officer in conjunction with a senior College Fellow who has relevant subspecialty experience. The Branch Education Officer's recommendation as to the applicant's eligibility for subspecialist assessment is to be submitted to the Education Board.

Assessment

1. Multiple choice paper consisting of 40 questions relating to the subspecialty.
2. Film reporting examination consisting of 10 stations relating to the subspecialty.
3. Radiodiagnosis oral examination relating to the subspecialty (45 minutes).
4. Pathology examination relating to the subspecialty (25 minutes).
